2023 Hansen Scholarship Program

Applications for the 2023 Hansen Scholarship Program available through the University of Melbourne are now open. They are for current Year 12 students. Valued at up to \$108,000, the scholarship provides approximately 20 new students each year with financial support, free accommodation at Little Hall, tailored mentoring and professional development opportunities throughout their undergraduate degree (and optional honours year) at the University of Melbourne. To be eligible, students must be Australian citizens, permanent residents or asylum seekers, aged 16-20 in year of application, and enrolled in an Australian Year 12 or IB, able to demonstrate financial need and on track for an ATAR score of 90+.
