We all know that it is important to stay motivated and organised when learning a new language. Did you know that it is also important to be a self-directed learner? This means that you actively seek out opportunities for language activities that you can do on a regular basis in order to progress. Here are some ideas for self-directed language learning.

- 1. Quizlets a wide variety of digital flashcards is available online. Ask your teachers also because they love to create Quizlets for you!
- 2. Audio and e-books in French are available from the library.
- 3. You can access ClickView for your year level in order to enjoy films, documentaries and other language learning material.
- 4. You can listen to music online. A great singer to listen to is "Sara'h" who does covers in French of many popular songs and her videos have subtitles too; seeing and hearing the language as you enjoy the music... what a great combination!
- 5. You can visit some of the approved language learning websites such as https://www.languagesonline.org.uk/. Ask your teacher for advice if you are not sure where to start!
- 6. You can ask your parents or carers to test you on vocabulary: provide them with flashcards where you have written the French word and the English translation. They say the English, and you say the French! Try to use as much French as you can at home you can even teach your family the French words you learn in class!

Remember: language learning shouldn't stop at 3.05pm!

National Australian Geography Competition 2024

The Australian Geography Competition is a contest for Australian secondary school students, assessing their geographical knowledge and skills, mostly made up of multiple-choice questions.

The Competition aims to encourage student interest in Geography and to reward student excellence. The annual Australian Geography Competition is running again this year from 15 to 29 of May and students from Years 7 to Year 12 are encouraged to participate in the competition, which will run during normal Humanities class time to minimize any disruption to classes.

A compass event will be created, any interested students are invited to seek parental consent to participate in this fabulous opportunity to showcase their knowledge of Geographical concepts. The entry deadline is Thursday 14 March, the cost is \$5 per student and certificates of participation are issued to each student.

All participants receive results and certificates (top 1% in Australia, high distinction, distinction, credit or participation). Students will be graded at school

Year levels – Year 7, Year 8, Year 9, Year 10, Year 11, and Year 12. Outstanding students at each Year level win prizes which include books and special certificates, and medals for first in Australia. In past years, Canterbury Girls' students have achieved exceptional results with many receiving High Distinctions, as well winning their respective age categories. For Year 11 students, there is the chance to represent Australia at the 2025 International Geography Olympiad in Bangkok, Thailand.



The competition ensures that students acquire world knowledge and skills that can help them to prepare for final exams.

NEVR CONCERT APPLICATIONS FOR LARGE ENSEMBLES: DUE DATE 20 MARCH

Step 1 - Notify Mr Sword or your instrumental music teacher that you are completing an application. Collect a rehearsal schedule and see your music teacher for your AMEB level so that you apply for the ensemble which is best suited to your playing skill level.

Step 2 - Check your school calendar for camps, etc., and make sure you are available for ALL rehearsal and concert dates and times. Let your school music coordinator know which ensemble/s you are applying for.

Step 3 - All applications for large ensembles need to be completed by parents/ guardians online at www.trybooking.com/COXWE by 20 March. It is important to get your application in as soon as possible to avoid missing out on a place. The application fee is \$20 per student.

Step 4 - Submit Action Plans for Asthma and/or Anaphylaxis to your school Music Coordinator to forward to NEVR Music, where applicable. NB: If these are not

submitted your application will not be processed.

Step 5 - Music Co-ordinators will be notified of all successful applicants, and you will receive a notice with rehearsal details in Term 2.


