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Teaching and Learning News

Food and Technology

Many of the students have been producing a range of items for their practical tests over the last few weeks.

Year 10 Masterclass have completed their pasta theory and then pasta task with some amazing results. Students made their own fresh pasta and then, using a pasta machine, rolled the dough to make the pasta. When cooked they used either a tomato or cream-based sauces, which were made with their own individual variations. Well done!



Year 9 World Food Bites

Again, some fantastic Mexican Chimichangas were produced by the students displaying a range of skills and abilities. They were delicious!



Year 12 Food Studies

In Term 1 we focused on the process of eating and digestion food and absorption of macronutrients, and looking at the functional properties of protein, sugar, starch, fats and oils and scientific chemical changes that occur to these components when cooked.

Some of the processes we have learnt through our practicals have been: Emulsification to make a hollandaise sauce, and then the use of a wet method of cookery, poaching, (using conduction and convection currents) causing denaturation and coagulation of the protein in the eggs. The muffins toasted by the students demonstrated dextrinisation of the starch.

We made Eggs Florentine using interestingly wilted indigenous Warrigal greens (from the school native garden) in place of spinach for the dish. Of course, the students enjoyed eating these afterwards as seen by the photos! To finish off the term Year 12s also made Hot Cross Buns - and looked at fermentation, and the properties required for yeast doughs to be successful. They were also a hit! Congratulations on your hard work!

Victorian Interschool Cycling Series (VICS)

The moment I saw this event in one of our past newsletters, I was so excited, as I found this the perfect opportunity for me as I had just begun racing, and it was even greater as I would be representing my school. The Victorian Interschool Cycling Series (VICS) runs across 4 events and is organised by 3 different cycling clubs.

The 1st race began with an Individual Time Trial (TT), organised by Blackburn Cycling Club, which was a 10km long individual sprint. I was so happy when I realized I came second!

The 2nd event was held at the same location, organised by the same club, although this one was a road race, being roughly 20km long. Unfortunately, I had some bad luck here, as another cyclist crashed onto me, but I managed to get up and to continue racing, finishing in 4th place with a broken bike!

The 3rd event was held at Sandown Racecourse, and it was sponsored by my club (Carnegie Caulfield Cycling Club), where I rode the 20km road race on a very windy circuit. I managed to defend myself coming in 3rd place.

And to finish up the series, the last event was held at Kew Boulevard, organised by Hawthorn Cycling Club. This was a road race and was a tough one, not only being a 20km long hilly circuit, but in wintry conditions too! I felt strong finishing in 2nd place.

With two second places, a third and a fourth, I ended up being the rider with most accumulated points across the four events, winning the Gold Medal for the Junior Women in the A category.

I hope we can get more and more girls into cycling, It's a great sport that anyone should try out!

CGSC Senior School Musical - The Three Penny Opera


