#### NEVR Concert Applications for large Ensembles: Due Date 20 March

Step 1 - Notify Mr Sword or your instrumental music teacher that you are completing an application. Collect a rehearsal schedule and see your music teacher for your AMEB level so that you apply for the ensemble which is best suited to your playing skill level.

Step 2 - Check your school calendar for camps, etc., and make sure you are available for ALL rehearsal and concert dates and times. Let your school music coordinator know which ensemble/s you are applying for.

Step 3 - All applications for large ensembles need to be completed by parents/guardians online at <a href="https://www.trybooking.com/COXWE">www.trybooking.com/COXWE</a> by 20 March. It is important to get your application in as soon as possible to avoid missing out on a place. The application fee is \$20 per student.

Step 4 - Submit Action Plans for Asthma and/or Anaphylaxis to your school Music Coordinator to forward to NEVR Music, where applicable. NB: If these are not submitted your application will not be processed.

Step 5 - Music Co-ordinators will be notified of all successful applicants, and you will receive a notice with rehearsal details in Term 2.


